

■ Background

- Residents reported their concern during interviews and at the Residents Association meetings.
 - Dog walkers use the village greens to exercise their animals.
 - Children play on the village greens.
 - Residents say they do not have sufficient places to put dog excreta.
- It is Council policy not to put dog excreta bins next to public highways, which limits some locations.

■ Location(s)

- Green by Church Lane Avenue, Hooley.

■ Action

- Allocate more dog excreta bins.
Responsibility: Reigate and Banstead Borough Council
- Consider the definition of highway for this purpose.
Responsibility: Reigate and Banstead Borough Council

■ Resource

- Provision of bins.

■ Timescale

- 6 months (completed).

■ Outcome measure/reporting

- Bins provided.

■ Local Community: What you can do

- Stop the dog fouling in public places, it is an offence.
 - Use bins where they are provided or take dog excreta home.
 - You can put dog muck in normal bins if wrapped.
 - Report persistent offenders to the Council for further investigation on 01737 276000.
