

■ Background

- The community and local business report through interviews, the Residents Association and Neighbourhood Watch meetings that there are problems with litter. Littering is a particular problem near the Crèche, Children's play areas and the Social Club, Village Hall and Recycling area.
- This is described as arising from:
 - People using the Village Hall and Social Club.
 - People walking through the area.
 - Children playing with the recycling materials.
- Vehicles passing through the village along the A23 also litter continually. This includes fast food wrappers and glass bottles thrown from moving cars and lorries losing part of their loads.
- Villagers appreciate that this area is cleaned regularly and that the responsibility is with individual drivers.

■ Location(s)

- Area off St. Margaret's Road around the recycling area, Village Hall and Social Club, adjoining the A23.

■ Action

- Provide additional litterbins.
Responsibility: Reigate and Banstead Borough Council
- Cut back overgrown vegetation around recycling bins.
Responsibility: Reigate and Banstead Borough Council
- Litter pick.
Responsibility: Community Groups, Youth Offending Team, Community Reparation

■ Resource

- Litter bins.
- Officer time.

■ Timescale

- 6 months to a year (completed).

■ Outcome measure/reporting

- Reduction in reports of litter.
- Monitored by Ward Councillors.

- Use the litterbins provided or take it home.
- Join the Spring Clean day.
- Encourage children to join the Spring Clean day too.
