

POLLUTION PREVENTION AND CONTROL ACT 1999

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT ADVERTISEMENT DETAILS

INTRODUCTION

There is no prescribed form for the advertisement; however, the specimen given below contains the details that are legally required to be placed by the operator in the newspapers circulating within the Borough.

(No advertisement is required for certain small waste oil burners or Mobile Plant)

SPECIMEN ADVERTISEMENT FOR PLACING IN LOCAL NEWSPAPER

Pollution Prevention and Control Act 1999

APPLICATION FOR PERMIT

Name of Applicant has applied for a permit from Reigate and Banstead Borough Council to operate **description of installation** at **name, if any, and address of premises where installation is to be carried on.**

Written representations regarding the application should be sent to the Head of Environmental Health Services at the above address, within 28 days of this advertisement.

Any representations made to Reigate and Banstead Borough Council will be placed on the public register unless the person making the representation requests, in writing, that they should not be so placed. Where such a request is made, the Council will place a statement on the public register indicating only that representations have been made which have been the subject of such a request.

NOTES

1. The advertisement must not be placed until at least two weeks have lapsed from the date the application has been made. This is to allow the local authority to check that the application is correct and to place a copy on the Public Register. An acknowledgement from the Council will be sent confirming receipt of the application and asking the operator to forward a copy of the actual newspaper advertisement certifying where and when it was published.
2. The deadline for placing the advertisement is no more than six weeks after submitting the application.
3. In cases where the applicant asks for confidential information to be excluded from the Public Register, the two and six week periods are taken from the date when the question of commercial confidentiality has been determined.
