

■ Background

- Anti social behaviour has been raised as an issue through the telephone survey, stakeholder interviews and was a top priority raised at the Police and Community Neighbourhood Consultative Committee.
- The number of anti social incidents in the area has risen, resulting in an increased fear of crime and a negative perception of the area. There has also been a high volume of media coverage concerning incidents in the area.
- It is believed that a proportion of the anti social behaviour occurs after the pubs have closed in Reigate and Woodhatch.

■ Location Across the Borough.

■ Actions and Responsible Agency

- Bids for funds to introduce the 'Shopwatch' and 'Pubwatch' schemes to Woodhatch and Reigate. This will provide better coordinated communication systems which will assist the Police to enforce the law concerned with ASB.

Responsibility Reigate and Banstead Borough Council, Community Liaison

- Co-ordinate and implement 'Shopwatch' and 'Pubwatch' schemes.

Responsibility Surrey Police

- Surrey Police.
- Crime and Disorder Reduction Partnership.
- Reigate and Banstead Borough Council Officer time to write a funding application.
- Shop keepers and pub landlords.

■ Timescale 6 months to a year to implement. Scheme will be ongoing.

■ Outcome Measure/Reporting

- Better enforcement.
- Reductions in reported anti social behaviour.
- Decreased fear of crime.
