

■ Background

- Repeatedly, dog fouling has been identified as a problem in the area.

■ Location(s) Mainly green spaces, the roads leading to them and alleyways in the area. *(See identified hotspots on the map) overleaf.*

■ Actions and Responsible Agency

- Look at how, with the help of the Neighbourhood Services Officers this problem can be minimised.
- Identify whether more bins or signage is necessary.
- Increased enforcement.
- Target hotspots by introducing a red flag survey.

Responsibility for all actions Reigate and Banstead Borough Council Neighbourhood Services

■ Resource

- Reigate and Banstead Borough Council Officer time.
- Investment in more dog foul bins and/or signage.
- Increased Neighbourhood Services resources to manage the issue. This may take the form of an awareness campaign or utilisation of mobile CCTV to aid enforcement.

■ Timescale Ongoing

■ Outcome Measure/Reporting

- Identify the extent of the problem/number of complaints in the area.
- A reduction in dog fouling.
