### **PLANNING AND ARCHAEOLOGY IN THE BOROUGH OF REIGATE AND BANSTEAD INCLUDING A LIST OF ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES**

## 1. INTRODUCTION

This document sets out Supplementary Planning Guidance on Planning and Archaeology, for the Borough Local Plan. It also lists in alphabetical street order the Borough's stock of Ancient Monuments, Sites of Archaeological Importance and Sites of High Archaeological Potential, as defined at present. These are also identified in numerical order by Site and Monument Record Number. The location of these numbers are identified on the Archaeological Sites Maps. The intention is to define all known sites worthy of preservation or recording. This should not be confused with the County Sites and Monuments Record which lists all finds, which may include stray finds, such as single coins, finds from sites whose location cannot now be accurately located, and finds from sites which have been destroyed by some form of development. The Borough Council publishes a List of Buildings of Architectural and Historic Interest as a separate document. Both documents will be updated annually.

## 2. COMMENTARY

Archaeology is a finite resource, a non-renewable source of information about our past; therefore, every effort should be made to preserve this resource whenever possible. When physical preservation is not possible, preservation as a record is essential, as once destroyed this information is lost forever.

### (1) Planning Policies

#### (A) Central Government

Planning Policy Guidance Note 16 "Archaeology & Planning" (issued November 1990) sets out Central Government guidance on this at National level. An English Heritage Advice Note, "Development Plan Policies for Archaeology" of December 1992 sets out English Heritage's views on archaeology.

#### (B) County

Policy E5 of the Surrey Structure Plan 1989 sets out the County archaeological policy, though a Replacement Plan 1992 Deposit Version is awaiting the EPI Panel's report. Detailed supplementary planning guidance is given in the County's "Policy for Archaeology and Planning in Surrey" adopted by the County in 1991.

#### (C) Local

The Inspector's report has been received for the Borough Local Plan and the relevant archaeological policy has been modified as follows:-

#### **\*Policy Pc 8**

**The Borough Council, in conjunction with English Heritage and Surrey County Council will identify, protect and preserve scheduled Ancient Monuments, their settings and County Sites of Archaeological Importance. The Borough Council will also encourage the management and interpretation of such sites to develop their educational and recreational potential.**

**The Borough Council in conjunction with Surrey County Council will identify Areas of High Archaeological Potential. When such areas are affected by development proposals, the Council will require field evaluation providing for proper and timely preservation or recording.**

**Where large scale developments occur outside known Areas of High Archaeological Potential the Borough Council will require an Archaeological Assessment to be submitted, together with the planning application, and may require an agreed scheme for investigation, monitoring and recording."**

(2) Sites

Four categories of sites can be identified:

- (A) Scheduled Ancient Monuments
- (B) County Sites of Archaeological Importance.
- (C) Sites and Areas of High Archaeological Potential.
- (D) Development sites of a sufficient size likely to lead to the discovery of archaeological finds.

(A) Scheduled Ancient Monuments

Scheduled Ancient Monuments are sites of national importance and should clearly be protected from any development. Their numbers are increasing due to the English Heritage Monument Protection Programme. There are 29 such sites in the Borough. It should not be forgotten that other sites may be unscheduled archaeological sites of national importance, but these have not been identified by the Secretary of State. Scheduled Ancient Monument Consent from Central Government will be required for any works to an Ancient Monument, even repair. There is also a statutory duty to have regard to the setting of the monuments. English Heritage should be consulted on any planning application affecting a Scheduled Ancient Monument.

(B) County Sites of Archaeological Importance

These sites are identified as worthy of preservation on the basis of the information in the County Sites and Monuments record. They include items such as moats and other known structures of archaeological importance. Six sites of archaeological importance have been identified in the Borough at present.

(C) Sites and Areas of High Archaeological Potential

The County maintains a Sites & Monuments Record of all reported archaeological finds. From this Sites and Areas of High Archaeological Potential have been identified as areas where further archaeological deposits are likely to exist. This includes historic town centres and other historic settlements - there are 174 Sites and Areas of High Archaeological Potential at present.

(D) Development sites of sufficient size likely to lead to the discovery of archaeological finds

It is always necessary to take into account that unexpected discoveries are frequently made. Clearly, it will not be expedient to monitor all proposed developments, but it is reasonable to assume that any development on a large scale is likely to affect archaeological deposits. Therefore, any site of one acre (0.4 hectares) or more will require an archaeological assessment. (Householder applications will be excused from assessment in this category).

It is intended to update this information annually by considering any new additions to the County Sites & Monuments Record, as well as any changes in criteria for designation of archaeological sites.

(3). Guidance on Archaeology and Development

Where possible, the archaeological effects of a proposed development will be considered at an early stage of the planning process before the submission of a formal planning application. The prospective developer will be expected to have made suitable arrangements to take archaeological considerations into account in his application. The Principal Archaeologist in the County Planning Department will advise on how to

prepare an archaeological assessment of the site so that sufficient information is available for the determination of the planning application. This will usually be the case for large developments such as golf courses or Areas of High Archaeological Potential.

When a planning application is received, the Borough Council will consult the Principal Archaeologist in the County Planning Department and The Reigate and Banstead Archaeological Coordination Committee, if it falls within any of the four categories previously identified. In general terms it may be expected that the loss of any part of a Scheduled Ancient Monument or a County Site of Archaeological Importance will not be permitted. Where a Site or Area of High Archaeological Potential is concerned, a proper investigation should be carried out at the appropriate time so that preservation of the archaeology can be secured, if necessary. Where satisfactory arrangements have not been made before submission of a planning application, it will be necessary to impose conditions, if permission is granted.

#### Cost

It is the County Council and Borough Council's policy that the developer should pay for any necessary archaeological work required as a result of development proposals. This funding should include provision for the study and conservation of the finds and publication of the results of the archaeological work.

#### (4) Standard Conditions

The following standard conditions are to be used:

1. No development shall take place until fencing has been erected, in a manner to be agreed with the Local Planning Authority, about (insert name of monument or site), and no works shall take place within the area inside that fencing without the consent of the Local Planning Authority.

#### Reason:

To ensure that no damage is caused to the monument in the course of the development.

2. No development shall take place until the applicant has secured the implementation of a programme of archaeological work in accordance with a written scheme of investigation which has been submitted by the applicant and approved by the Planning Authority.

#### Reason:

The site is one of (within an Area of) High Archaeological Potential and it is important that the archaeological information should be preserved as a record before it is destroyed by the development.

#### OR reason:

The development proposed covers a large surface area and it is therefore considered likely that it will affect currently unknown archaeological information. It is important that the site is surveyed and work is carried out as necessary in order to preserve as a record any such information before it is destroyed by the development.

#### 3. CONSULTATIONS

Early consultation with the County Principal Archaeologist is recommended for all works affecting archaeological sites.
