A secondary Neolithic surface site "on the north slopes of the valley opposite Stagbury" is listed. Flakes and a borer have been found. See also HER 969 for other flints found along the north bank of the railway.

The find area would seem to cover the Park Downs/Park area. However, perambulation and enquiries at the farm during 1965 produced no further information.

Water tower at right end, to rear, has concrete bands, tile-hung stair tower to rear left, and hipped roof with gablets. Left return range: main block is in same style as garden elevation, having 3 bays under 2 oversailing gables on right of lateral stack with lower projecting bay on right. Further left is a lower, 1-storey with attic, 2-bay block which has half-timbered gables with pebble-dashed infill and which is probably part of the original Shaw house.

To far left is former nurses' home which has panelled door on right, metal casement windows, and gabled dormers. Courtyard elevation of former nurses' home has entry at right end and 3rd floor cornice which rises under pent roof to 3 wide gables (one at left end, 2 at right end).

Courtyard elevation of main block has entrance bay with decorative ashlar doorcase to panelled, arched, door, the cornice on fluted columns and supporting 2-storey canted bay window; on left, outskirt with panelled door and wide window; various gabled dormers and tall ribbed stacks; reused rainwater heads dated 1884.

The Shaw house was built for the Garton family. Goodhard-Rendel's design centred upon this building, which was to become the administrative block, but the original house was almost entirely destroyed by fire in 1939 and was subsequently rebuilt to a design by Goodhard-Rendel. Originally there was to be second ward block (further to right) and another nurses' home to complete the rear courtyard, but work was interrupted by war and these were never built.

Banstead Wood (known as Banstead Park Estate) was a deer park in the Medieval period sheltering the royal deer (enclosed in 1439). In 1598 Banstead Park was stated to contain about 160 acres. It belonged to the Spencer family in 1841 when the name changed to Banstead Wood. There was a Victorian rhododendron garden and drive surrounding the house built by Norman Shaw in the 1880s for Francis Baring, a merchant banker. The gardens round the Victorian house were developed by the Garton family, who bought the property in 1893, from species collected on their expeditions to Asia and the far east. The rhododendrons on the drive and in hospital grounds are non-invasive rare varieties.

Description

Archaeological observations on length of new pipeline (TQ273583 to TQ272571). About three mesolithic or Neolithic struck flints from the whole length, but just behind (west) of Dene Farm the pipeline has clipped the edge of a parcel of woodland at TQ 2730 5753, and in re-instating they've scraped the surface revealling in-situ archaeology. This area of woodland is a very sticky/silty/clayey pale orange soil, unlike the chalkier surrounding areas, and contains a large quantity of early to mid 13th century pottery, in fairly small abraded sherds. We recovered (from an area of 5-10m2) 54 pieces of exposed pottery - 41 grey brown sandy ware, 8 sandy red ware, 5 Surrey whiteware (of which 4 were coarse border ware). The assemblage included about 3 rims. There was pottery of a similar date visible on the surface 10m further back into the woodland. The sherds are fairly mixed fabrics suggesting this is maybe a midden dump used for fertilising a small area of cultified land. The Surrey Place Names book refers to a record of habitation at Dene Farm as far back as 1301.
